

YOUTH MINISTRY

Middle School Youth Urban Immersion Mission Trip

Earlier this month, a group of HMPC Middle School Youth participated in an urban immersion mission trip in Charlotte at CROSS Missions, a ministry of Myers Park Presbyterian Church. It was a fruitful and meaningful weekend of service, learning about the reality of those on the margins, and how we are able, with just a short amount of time, to be the "hands and feet" of Christ through the giving of our time and talents. The two local agencies for which they served during the weekend were the Diaper Bank of Charlotte and Crisis Assistance Ministry.
