# INTERIM PASTOR SEARCH BEGINS

### Committee Formed & Timeline Overview

In the October 27 issue of *The Weekly Window*. I laid out the process around installing a new Pastor and Head of Staff. That process is well underway.

Here is an update on where we stand:

#### 1. Period of Closure with Pastor Mac

We took the time to celebrate the ministry of Pastor Mac and wished him well with his new call in Pennsylvania. We sent him off with a nice gift and a generous love offering. Praise be to God for the generosity of this community of faith!

### 2. Bridging the Gap in Leadership

Session has affirmed Pastor Debbie as the Bridge Interim Pastor and Head of Staff while we move to the next step in the process.

#### 3. Interim Pastor Search Committee

The Session has elected four dedicated members to the Interim Pastor Nominating Committee.

They are:

- Grace Hutchinson
- John James
- Laura McHenry
- **Bob Monroe**

These four saints will work closely with the Personnel Committee and the Presbytery of New Hope Committee on Ministry to recommend a candidate for Interim Pastor to Session.









#### 4. Interim Pastor Ministry

Once selected, the Interim Pastor will guide us through key interim tasks, including conducting a Mission Study. This study will help us discern our church's future vision and priorities.

### 5. Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)

After the Mission Study is approved, the Session will set up a nominating process for the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), which will be led by the Hudson Nominating Committee. The congregation will elect the PNC, which will begin the formal search for Hudson's fifth installed Pastor & Head of Staff.

#### 6. Search and Installation of a New Pastor

The PNC will work diligently, writing a Mission Discernment Profile and conducting interviews to identify the right candidate to lead us into the future. When a candidate is selected, the congregation will vote to call the new pastor.

This process, from the beginning of the interim period to the arrival of a newly installed pastor, is expected to take about 1.5 to 2 years. Throughout this time, we will need your prayers, your participation, and your patience. We trust that God is already preparing the next pastor to shepherd our congregation. Let us move forward in hope, grounded in the knowledge that God is faithful in every season of life, including times of transition. As we walk through this together, may we rely on one another and on the guidance of the Holy Spirit.



#### **ELECTION**

Dear Hudson Friends,

In this post-election week, I am aware that many people have mixed feelings about some of the results. As Vice President Harris said: "A fundamental principle of American democracy is that when we lose an election, we accept the results. That principle, as much as any other, distinguishes democracy from monarchy or tyranny. And anyone who seeks the public trust must honor it."

Wherever we are with our elected officials, as people of faith we are called to care for one another and be especially attentive to those who are struggling.

I share these wise words from BJ Owens, Dean of Trinity Cathedral in Cleveland Ohio, written to his congregation the day after the election:

As a pastor and a parent, but also a person of privilege, my heart is with those who will feel these pains (of some of the election results) in a way that is immediate and unrelenting.

I also believe that much of the work before us today is the same regardless of who was elected last night: the work of dignity and justice is holy and necessary, but it is also costly and requires much of us.

This work requires humility and strength and the ability to see the struggles and dignity of all our neighbors. It requires hope, and above all, the work requires faith. Not faith in a God with all the answers, but faith that the one who created us is with us in moments of fear, in a God who is known in how we love our neighbors and how we serve those in need.

Ability to pour juice, dry dishes, and chat with committee members.



# An Announcement from Pastor Debbie



Dear Hudson Friends, I share this news as a significant part of the pastoral transition at HMPC. It turns out that at the same time Mac was discerning his next call, I was also considering a change in the focus of my ministry. About two years ago, I intentionally took a "sabbatical" from most

of my Presbytery responsibilities to be more involved with some of the organizations whose causes I support. Then a few months ago, one of those organizations contacted me asking if I might be interested in working with them in a position they had open. While I did not pursue it, it piqued my imagination as to what a "second act" of ministry might look like for me. Since 1981, my professional ministry has been serving local congregations and it became clear to me that to open up my life for something different, the time is right to retire from active ministry on January 31, 2025.

Simultaneously, Mac and I shared our news with each other in the same conversation. It was important that this information was only divulged to the Personnel Committee until we celebrated Mac's ministry with us and blessed him as he left for his new congregation. In the meantime, the Personnel Committee and Session asked me to serve as your Bridge Interim Pastor, and I happily agreed. We have an incredibly gifted staff, and together with all of you we are moving forward just as we always do.

The process for ending our formal relationship is essentially the same as it was with Mac. HMPC and New Hope Presbytery will affirm my next steps as I have requested. What is different is that we are not bound to a short timeline because I am retiring rather than accepting another installed position. I will still be living in Raleigh so I won't be going far, just in a different direction than the one we have shared for so long.

For twenty years it has been a sacred privilege to be with you through each and every season, including numerous staff and pastoral transitions. Now we have entered another season in our life together, and though I will not be going on the interim journey with you, I am grateful that I am able to help you prepare for it and the interim leadership who will be here. I believe that God opened the space for new directions—for Mac and for me in our individual journeys and for our beloved congregation.

I am aware it is a lot for both installed pastors to leave at the same time. However, I am confident God will guide you in finding the right people to fill these positions. I am fully committed to our shared ministry for the next three months, and I am excited about all we have going on through the end of the year: Stewardship conclusion and prayerfully creating the 2025 budget, Children's Sabbath, end-of-the-year events, the Advent/Christmas Season, and more.

Please know how I dearly wish I could have shared this discernment and decision with each of you inperson. Now that this is public, we can talk freely together. We are blessed to have these next few months, so please invite me to join your activities, classes, gatherings, and meetings for fellowship, and/ or there are things you need assistance with. The Interim Pastor Search Committee has been selected and is getting to work. I am not a part of the search, though of course, I am happy to discuss the transition process with you. After the first of the year we will plan on saying goodbye, for now we will go forward in faith, hope, and love that are the strength of our community.
