Natasha Vedder, a pastor in British Columbia writes, “Lent is a time to become more open to God through the vulnerabilities of life. It comes with an especially poignant invitation to join with others in bringing our doubts, fear, sorrow, loneliness, and dryness before God, hoping to taste God’s promised provision in the deserts of life.”

During the season of Lent, in worship we will be looking at scriptures where God faithfully provides nourishment for people in need. In the spirit of this, our theme is **A Table in the Wilderness**: An image of a place of welcome, rest and sustenance in the desert of life. When so much in life sucks us dry, how can we experience the quenching work of God to give us the strength, perseverance and hope to carry on? We encourage you to commit or re-commit to the rhythms of worship throughout Lent.

The Book of Common Worship reminds us, “Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent with a public act of confession...Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance, sorrow, and

Waking Up With The Word Tuesday, February 6 | 6:30am | Zoom



This is an early morning men's Bible study. It meets in-person and on Zoom, alternating weekly. It uses an ancient study method called *lectio divina*. We read the passage that will be preached on the upcoming Sunday four times, with interspersed questions:

What's a word or phrase that stands out to you? Allow that word or phrase to develop into a memory from your life, a thought you have on the passage, or a metaphor? What is Christ calling you to through the passage?

Registration Info: HMPC women attend as a group and register individually. It works well for us to stay at the Assembly Inn which is centrally located to all activities and accommodates our

group eating and sharing the weekend together. To register, click on the [conference registration link](#) and follow the steps. If you are staying at the Inn, confirm you are registering for the Comprehensive Package. Under *Property*, click Assembly Inn and choose your room preference. There will be a place to note if you have a roommate. Each person registers separately, so be sure you list the other(s) in your room on the form. Full payment is required at registration, \$400-\$500 depending on the room and roommate(s). The Inn typically fills quickly and I encourage you to register as soon as you can. There is a generous refund policy, a full refund less a \$25 service charge through June 25th, and refunds prorated after that, so if you are considering going we suggest you proceed with a reservation and adjust later if necessary. In the comment section, you can note that you are with the Hudson Memorial Presbyterian Church Raleigh group. If the Inn is full when you are registering, the site will direct you to another Montreat property or you can stay elsewhere. You can also be put on a waitlist for the Inn and typically almost everyone on the list gets in. Reach out to Debbie Kirk with questions or for more information as well.

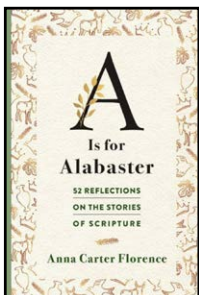
