

FINAL WEEK - JUNE SPECIAL OFFERING: Avery County Mission Trip

During June, the church is supporting the Avery County Adult Mission Trip, which will be underway in late July to aid Avery County Habitat for Humanity in its home builds. Eleven individuals (so far) have committed to joining the Mission Trip; and many of them will be contributing \$250 each to help defray the trip's expenses.



Nonetheless, we need the assistance of the congregation to fully meet this year's costs and to provide the reserve needed to meet next year's advance reservation expenses. Due to the congregation's generosity, we have reached \$5,442, only \$758 from for Humanity[®] reaching our \$6,200 goal.

FINAL WEEK - JUNE TEND MY SHEEP: Inter-Faith Food Shuttle



The organization that the church is supporting during June is the Inter-Faith Food Shuttle, which seeks to ameliorate hunger in our area by recovering and distributing food, teaching how to grow food sustainably, and demonstrating how to shop and prepare it in ways that are affordable and healthy. The Inter-Faith

Food Shuttle distributed 9 million pounds of food last year through its many programs, including the Backpack Buddies program for school-age children and a Senior Nutrition program for older adults. The requested items for this month are rice, pasta, and breakfast items.

ANOTHER WAY TO DONATE: In addition to bringing these items to the church and leaving them as usual in the Sanctuary collection bins, the Mission Committee is introducing an alternative way for you to make actual food donations. Through an organization known as Benevolist, we have set up a June food drive for the Inter-Faith Food shuttle. The link for that drive is **HERE.** Without additional cost you may select and purchase from the food options found on the site and have your selections automatically delivered to the Food Shuttle at its address. When, as requested, you report your purchases on Hudson's food drive site set up through Benevolist, the site will account for the congregation's aggregate purchases made in June through the site.

Summer Project for the Food Bank Off to a Good Start!





As we did last summer, the Mission Committee is hosting a hands-on project at Hudson

for the NC Food Bank. The Food Bank has delivered a very large spool of red mesh which will be transformed into 6,000 produce bags. Each bag will be packed with 5 pounds of fresh produce which the Food Bank will make available to people across their service area through food pantries, such as the one at North Raleigh Ministries. This small project has a big impact and we invite everyone to participate as you are at the church enjoying fellowship, volunteering in the church office, etc. The Committee has pre-cut bags so all you need to do is tie off the ends.

The project is going well so far! The bins are filling up with the completed produce bags. Grab some material and tie off some bags this week! You can bring them back and put them in the bins in Westminster Hall.

SESSION

June Session Update

- Pastors Mac and Debbie opened the meeting with a Litany of Gifts and Service for the installation of Harry Bowles as a Ruling Elder in the class of 2027.
- Session elected to continue with the current policy of providing family health coverage benefits for full-time, called pastors. They also approved an update to the health benefit coverage policy for full-time program staff. HMPC will continue to pay the amount equal to the employee-only premium for the highest value plan. If the employee elects a lesser value plan, for example the EPO with employee/dependent coverage, HMPC will pay 100% of the employee coverage and the remaining amount will be applied to the dependent premium. If the employee elects employee-only coverage on a lesser value plan, HMPC will only pay the employee only premium.
- Allie Maples and Karen Melling, co-chairs of the Property Committee, presented four projects that require funding outside of the 2024 budget. The projects require \$32,000 for sanctuary and arcade repair/painting, replace and repair the external drainage system, upgrade HVAC software, and roof and gutter repairs. Session voted to fund the projects from a combination of a possible donation from the preschool and from designated funds within the foundation.
- Elders Jay Cummins and Steve Guy were elected to represent Hudson at the 122nd Stated Gathering of Presbytery on July 23 at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Durham.
- Elder Don Haydon, as liaison to the Finance Committee, gave an update on the year-to-date finances. Pledges are \$26,000 over budget, and non-pledge offerings are \$23,000 behind budget. On the expense side, Property is \$13,000 over budget and Outreach & Mission is temporarily \$10,000 under budget. The General Fund is running a surplus of \$14,000 over budget.
- The Session thanks Business Manager Erica Hairston and Carol Cox for their work in publishing the new Manual of Operations (MOO!) that is a compilation of all of Hudson's policies, procedures, and by-laws.
- Pastor Schafer's Staff Report at Session indicated that Elder Lizzie Graybill and Deacon Mary Schindo will be coordinating Hudson's effort to host the 123rd Stated meeting of Presbytery on Saturday, October 26th. We will need lots of volunteers for this event.
