

JULY TEND MY SHEEP: Green Elementary BACKPACKS + SCHOOL SUPPLIES



Green Elementary is our neighbor public elementary school - it is a Title I school which means that a significant portion of its students receive free or reduced lunches and have extra needs required to achieve an equitable education. Hudson is working with the school's

social worker to provide backpacks and school supplies to those children most in need. We are collecting backpacks, headphones (no earbuds or wireless please), #2 pencils, composition notebooks, crayons, colored pencils, dry erase markers, safety scissors, two pocket folders, glue sticks, and wide ruled paper. We will continue to collect these items through the first two weeks in August.

Avery County Mission Trip A Note of Gratitude

We would first like to express deep gratitude to the

congregation for how very generously it supported the Mission Trip Special Offering, providing \$2,000 above this year's expected expenses not only to meet next year's advance room reservation costs, but also to provide a solid initial reserve for remaining 2025 trip expenses. Thank you for your contributions!

Some Unexpected News

Unfortunately, we must report that the trip unexpectedly was called off at essentially the last minute. Two successive water purity tests taken Thursday and Friday of last week found bacteria in the well-based water system of Holston Presbyterian Camp & Retreat Center, at which we had arranged our room and board for our trip participants this year as had been done for the last eight years. After receiving the second test results in the late morning of last Saturday, Holston responsibly decided to shut down during the present week to attend to the problem and conveyed that decision to us as soon as possible in the first minutes of Saturday afternoon. Under these very late arising circumstances, and not perceiving how a viable alternative that would meet the needs of the participants could be arranged over the weekend on such short order, our organizer called the trip off. Holston, of course, is refunding the sums that Hudson paid for room and board; and the Mission Committee will be deciding how to best utilize the refund consistent with the expectations of both the congregation and the participants who supplied those funds. The bottom line, though, is that the trip, which had received such tremendous congregational support, did not proceed. We look forward to our trip next year and already have made our reservations for July 20-25, 2025, with both Holston Camp and Avery County Habitat.
