SEPTEMBER 29 AFTER WORSHIP

HMPC is a Matthew 25 Congregation. We are one of 1,235 congregations which have committed to "actively engage in the world around us, and act boldly and compassionately to serve those marginalized and in need - those who are poor, hungry, thirsty, naked, sick, imprisoned and strangers."

The U.S. Farm Bill (a very large piece of legislation taken up by Congress) is a "comprehensive omnibus bill that is the primary agricultural and food policy instrument of the federal government. Congress typically passes a new farm bill every five to six years." The Farm, Food and National Security Act (H.R. 8746) for 2024 is pending in Congress. Approximately 80% of the \$1.5 trillion cost will go to fund the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, which over 40 million Americans rely upon to put food on their tables. Without these benefits, millions of people go hungry. We need vour assistance in encouraging Congress to pass this legislation.

Please join us in Westminster Hall after the service on Sunday, September 29, to write a letter to each of your U.S. Senators (Senators Thom Tillis and Ted Budd) and your U.S. Representative (Congresswoman Deborah Ross or another depending upon where you live). Sample letters, stationery, pens, and refreshments will be provided.





A Message From Session

Dear Congregation,

Greetings in the name of our Lord!



As we prepare to celebrate the ministry of our beloved Pastor and Head of Staff, Mac Schafer, we want to take a moment to update you on the process of transitioning to a new pastor, while also highlighting the importance of cherishing the remaining time we have with Mac.

Primarily, our focus over the next several weeks will be to celebrate and give thanks for Pastor Mac's faithful service to our church. His final day with us will be Sunday, October 20, and on that day, we will gather as a congregation after worship to celebrate his ministry and give thanks for his leadership. We encourage everyone to participate in this special day as we express our gratitude for his 15 years of service.



The Process of Transition

While we focus on celebrating Pastor's Mac's ministry, we also want to share the steps we will be taking to find our next pastor. Below is an outline of the transition process:

1. Period of Closure with Our Present Pastor (Now to October 20)

During this time, we encourage all of us to step up in service through our time, talents, and resources, as we prepare for this transition. Pastor Mac will continue to lead us with grace, and in accordance with the Presbytery of New Hope's guidelines, he will observe a separation ethic after his departure.

On October 20 – immediately following worship, we will hold a congregational meeting to formally "dissolve the call" as part of the transition process.

2. Bridging the Gap in Leadership

The Session and Personnel have begun working with the Presbytery of New Hope's Commission on Ministry (COM) to determine how to bridge the gap in pastoral leadership before an Interim Pastor begins.

3. Interim Pastor Search Committee

The Session will form a committee to work with the Presbytery and our denominational connections to select an Interim Pastor. Given the unique history and needs of our congregation, this will be an especially important step in the process.

4. Interim Pastor Ministry

Once selected, the Interim Pastor will guide us through key interim tasks, including conducting a Mission Study. This study will help us discern our church's future vision and priorities.

5. Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)

After the Mission Study is approved, the Session will set up a nominating process for the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). The congregation will elect this committee, which will begin the formal search for Hudson's fifth installed pastor and head of staff.

6. Search and Installation of a New Pastor

The PNC will work diligently, writing a Mission Discernment Profile and conducting interviews to identify the right candidate to lead us into the future. When a candidate is selected, the congregation will vote to call the new pastor.

This process, from the beginning of the interim period to the arrival of a newly installed pastor, is expected to take about 1.5 to 2 years. Throughout this time, we will need your prayers, your participation, and your patience. We trust that God is already preparing the next pastor to shepherd our congregation.

Let us move forward in hope, grounded in the knowledge that God is faithful in every season of life, including times of transition. As we walk through this together, may we rely on one another and on the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
