
While we will have chairs available, **please bring your own lawn/camp chairs** as well as appropriate clothing for this outdoor service.


All barks, meows, and tweets will join our human voices in praising the Lord!




"Do You Experience God's Grace Working In Your Life During Advent?"



BLUE CHRISTMAS: A SERVICE OF SHADOWS

As we enter another Advent season, the season evokes many feelings, images, memories, and stories. We may be filled with excited anticipation or anxious dread. For many of us, the season is a mixture of both. The frenetic pace of the holidays may cause the time to pass quickly, while the extended hours of darkness can make each day seem endless. Each moment is unique as winter's changing lights that cast shadows invite us into the sacred presence of God.

To assist us in framing our Advent journeys, the Deacons are leading a worship service on Sunday, December 3, in the Chapel at 6:00pm. We emphasize the color blue as distinct from the traditional liturgical color, purple, and the popular holiday colors, red and green, as a reminder of the range of emotions during the holidays. The service is for everyone who would like a quiet reflective time with the reading of scripture, prayers, contemplative music, and the lighting of candles in recognition of God's presence in our places of greatest



need. The liturgical space will be created by Rich Richards and his youth team to reflect the shadows of the season.






2024 Pledge Campaign Progress Update

AS OF NOVEMBER 21, 2023



Thank you to all who have submitted your pledges thus far. Collectively, our pledges provide our Finance Committee and Session with vital information as they work to prepare our 2024 budget.

As of November 21, 2023, our received pledges total \$740,551 (still \$85k away from our goal of \$825k). We currently have 154 households who have submitted pledges--Last year we had a total of 185 pledging households.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

Scholarships Available THROUGH PW



The Presbyterian Women offer two scholarships every year. Starting January 1, both PW college and campership scholarship applications will be open. The deadline for submission is March 1st. They do require letters of recommendation.

To apply for the campership scholarship, Youth (for

grades 6 through 12) must live in the Presbytery and be a member of a church in the Presbytery. Campers may attend the camp/youth event of their choice, but preference may be given to those who are attending a Presbyterian-related camp. Value of the campership is \$250.

To apply for the college scholarship, applicants must live in the Presbytery and be a member of a church in the Presbytery. Applicants may attend the college of their choice, but preference may be given to those applicants who are attending a Presbyterian-related college. The amount awarded depends on the funds available and number of awards.

Waking Up With The Word

Tuesday, Nov. 28 | 6:30am | Zoom



This is an early morning men's Bible study. It meets in-person and on Zoom, alternating weekly. It uses an ancient study method called *lectio divina*. We read the passage that will be preached on the upcoming Sunday four times,

with interspersed questions: What's a word or phrase that stands out to you? Allow that word or phrase to develop into a memory from your life, a thought you have on the passage, or a metaphor? What is Christ calling you to through the passage?

No previous Bible study experience is necessary. At in-person meetings we provide coffee and Bibles. In the fall and winter months, we do the study around a fire. If you'd like to be added to the reminder list for the group please contact Pastor Mac.

Tend My Sheep Offering for November - FINAL WEEK



The Mission Committee's November Tend My Sheep collection focuses on the congregation's support of Housing Options for Students Today (HOST).

The Mission of HOST is to prevent college student homelessness by providing temporary safe and stable housing in the homes of local hosts, and assisting students to exit the host home into permanent housing.

HOST matches students who need short-term housing with hosts who provide a safe, private, affirming space in their home. Students prepare for long-term stable housing with support from a caring case manager advocate.

We will be collecting sheet sets, towel sets, and personal items including items of dental hygiene, deodorant, shampoo, etc. which will be part of care packages provided to students by HOST. Once students are able to find permanent housing on campus or in an apartment they will be able to take the sheets and towels to have a leg up on housekeeping necessities. Please bring your donations to the bins at Sanctuary entrances no later than Sunday, November 26.
