

We all enjoy a change of pace in the summer! Our Adult Summer Sunday School Series, coordinated by the Adult Committee, gives our teachers and leaders a break, encourages fellowship among folks from the different classes, and provides the opportunity to hear from a variety of individuals from our congregation and community on various topics of interest. Highlights this year include three sessions hosted by our Mission Committee (on behalf of Hunger Action), including a popular hands-on packing event, as well as conversations on stewardship of the earth. Pastor Mac will share about his May walking adventure, and Pastor Debbie will facilitate as we watch and discuss David LaMotte's latest TED talk. Whether you are a regular Sunday School participant, teach elsewhere during the year, or don't usually attend an adult class, we encourage you to come any time you can, and bring friends!

On the holiday weekends of May 26 (Memorial Day) and September 1 (Labor Day), adult classes are <u>not</u> meeting.
