
### PW HONORARY LIFE MEMBER AWARD PRESENTATION THIS SUNDAY, APRIL 28



This week in worship we celebrate the Presbyterian Women's Honorary Life Member award for 2024! The Honorary Life Member award, established in 1912 by the Presbyterian Church, is conferred to honor faithful service to the church and to Presbyterian Women. The recipient receives the HLM butterfly pin which is a symbol of newness in Christ and represents the values held closely by PW: supportive hands building an inclusive community; a leaf to represent nurture and growth of personal faith; the dove indicates work for peace; the center cross represents Christ, who is at the center of our lives.

### **Hudson Handy Helpers**

Hudson Handy Helpers (HHH) was started about six years ago as a result of a member with cancer asking for help with her home repairs. The church was supplying meals and transportation.

Over the years, we have helped both church members and others supported by Hudson Memorial and have had outside requests from organizations, such as Step-Up Ministries and Rebuilding Together of the Triangle, and individual friends of our congregation.

We help people move into retirement communities, make donations to North Raleigh Ministries and ReStore, Déjà Vu Thrift Store, and make dump runs, help older members with their yards, do minor home repairs, and consult (if needed) where outside contractors are being hired.

We have installed grab bars in bathrooms, built ramps and steps, replaced lights and faucets, picked up and delivered furniture and bedding.

Our congregation has been generous in supporting HHH and as a result, funds have been used by the Mission Committee and the church to fund local needs.

In 2024 we have 20+ men and women and teenagers in Handy Helpers on about 35-40 projects.

Please contact the church office, our ministers, and your deacons if you need assistance.

## April Tend My Sheep NORTH RALEIGH MINISTRIES



This month's TMS offering is for North Raleigh Ministries Food Pantry. When donating, here are some important guidelines to remember:

Food items like peanut butter, pasta, canned soup, canned fish, canned beans, and canned vegetables are typically the best options to donate year-round.

Remember: all items should be in date, nonperishable, shelf-stable, factory-sealed in original packaging, in non-breakable containers, and easy to open (i.e. pop-top cans). Products that are single-serve should be left in the multi-pack. Due to food safety regulations, do not donate food items that are unsealed, loose items without ingredients listed, glass containers, or individual servings of baby food as these items must be discarded. If you are donating something that requires another item to prepare it like milk or oil, it is helpful to donate that as well. **Donations can be placed in the bins by Sanctuary entrances throughout the month of April.** 

### Habitat for Humanity Interfaith Coalition Build IN NEED OF VOLUNTEERS FOR MAY 18

This year we will once again be building at Old Poole Place neighborhood. This 105-home neighborhood is going up near the intersection of Old Poole Road and New Hope Road in Southeast Raleigh, and will feature 60 single-family homes and 45 townhomes, all built by Habitat.

The Spring Old Poole Place Build is a building and advocacy campaign to advance a more beloved community with justice, equal opportunity, and love for all. We will start and finish 2 new homes and help to finish other homes underway in the Old Poole Place neighborhood.
